#### Item 4.1 DPA Mike Neubauer

Mr. Neubauer played a video that states this generation is expected to live 5 years less than their parents.

Daily physical activity or DPA is being looked at board wide. The school is going to approach it by breaking up the DPA into 5 minute pockets instead of one 20 minute block. As the 20 minute block can be difficult to schedule. Research tells us a 150 minutes of vigorous exercise per week will extend life 4 to 6 years. No more than 2 hours per day of sedimentary sitting is recommended. Brain scans show the brain is more active after movement and physical activity. Incorporating movement as teachers are reviewing information and learning is a new goal. Teachers are brainstorming this PD Day Nov 17/2017 on this subject. Teachers are going to be doing some of the DPA energy break outside. It is important to dress appropriately for outside activity.

## Item 7.2 Family Christmas Night

Keisha went through the program plan. A Volunteer form has been sent home to families and is due back Nov 16/17. The event requires about 25 volunteers for the night. At this time the giving tree will be done as it has in the passed but will be reevaluated for future family Christmas nights.

Our kids have an hour lunch at 10:45 to 11:45. Currently they eat first then go outside. We are examining the possibility of switching that. Staff have been brainstorming advantages and disadvantages of this. Staff are thinking they will have an appetite after recess versus before recess. As well moving the time would protect instructional time by switching the lunch. Some staff are not in favor but they are discussing this. Council did say it could be challenging for classes who have gym right after lunch. Mr Young did say older kids tend to have gym after lunch and they eat quickly. Christine did mention students in program support tend to eat lunch at last snack because they are not hungry that early. Mr. Young says we need to give it a good time period to see if it works then re-examine.

A Board speaker Dr. Craig is coming in to do a Safe school presentation. It is from 1 in the afternoon till 3:30 at board office. Mr. Neubauer asked council to check their schedules and get back to him if anyone was interested in attending.
